Schools will re-open full-time in September 2020 – here's what you need to know

Today, the government announced that all publicly funded schools will re-open in September.

- > All publicly funded elementary schools will resume in September, in class, full-time, five days a week
 - $\circ~$ Class sizes will remain at the mandated maximum levels in place before the COVID-19 outbreak
- > Most secondary school students will split their time between the classroom and online learning
 - Secondary students in "designated boards" in areas with relatively high student populations (higher risk) will attend school on alternating days, in cohorts of 15 students
 - \circ Schools with lower student populations (lower risk) will return to the classroom full-time
- Parents will be able to opt their children out of in-person classes, at their discretion. Children with special education needs who struggle with remote learning will be allowed to attend school daily
- Schools can offer clubs and organized sports if physical distancing is possible and spaces are cleaned and disinfected between each use

Personal Protective Equipment

The provincial government has committed \$309 million to the education plan for PPE, staffing, cleaning supplies, health and safety training, lab testing capacity, additional public health nurses, mental health supports and students with special needs

- Students in Grades 4 through 12 will be required to wear a non-medical mask or cloth face covering while at school
- ➢ For younger learners, masks are recommended, but will be optional
- All educators and staff will be equipped with necessary PPE including medical masks

Childcare

Licensed child care centers will be permitted to operate at full capacity beginning September 1, 2020

- All child care staff will be required to wear masks at all times
- Screening measures will be established for staff and children entering the childcare facilities
- Parents and guardians have until August 31, 2020 to apply for Support for Families. Under this program, parents or guardians of children between 0-12 years old, or up to 21 years old for children and youth with special needs, are eligible for a one-time payment, per child, to purchase educational materials to support learning at home.
