## Giving Back



Over the last several weeks, our team has been collecting items under our "Giving Tree" for <u>The Busby Centre</u>, a local not-for-profit organization working to advocate for and improve conditions for individuals and families within South Georgian Bay and the County of Simcoe who are experiencing homelessness or at immanent risk.

### Recent Changes to Indeed's Job Ads

The recruitment platform Indeed has announced an update to its pricing model for job ad visibility. As of October 1, the visibility of newly posted free job ads in search results will decline after 1-2 weeks, while existing free job ads will no longer receive traffic. They specify that job ads must have paid sponsorship to maintain visibility. Indeed also notes that it may limit the number of free job ads employers are allowed to post.

This change is applicable to all postings on Indeed, including those fed by a company's career site or ATS, and is intended to improve the candidate experience by controlling employers posting duplicate ads, refreshing too often, and to prevent illegitimate ads.

Indeed's job sponsorship budgets have two options: a daily budget charged when someone clicks to view your job post ("Pay-Per-Click"), or a monthly budget charged when someone applies to the job post. The minimum budget for these two models can vary depending on the job and location, from \$8/day for a daily budget, and from \$240/month for monthly budgets.

### Minimum Wage Increases in 2024

Effective October 1, several provinces have implemented increases to the minimum wage. This includes Manitoba, Ontario, and Saskatchewan. Please refer to the chart below for the current minimum wage in your respective province.
