

AED Requirement on Construction Projects

Under Ontario's Occupational Health and Safety Act, construction projects that are expected to last more than three (3) months will be required to install and maintain an Automated External Defibrillator (AED), along with all necessary accessories to use this device. This requirement stems from a recent amendment to the <u>Construction Projects Regulation</u>, and will take effect on January 1, 2026.

Ontario's "As of Right" Framework

Starting January 1, 2026, Ontario's <u>"As of Right" framework</u> will streamline the hiring process for certified professionals from other Canadian provinces and territories. Under this new approach:

- Upon submitting their registration documents to the Ontario regulatory authority, individuals will receive confirmation within 10 business days that they are deemed to be certified and can start working in the province, without waiting for full registration.
- While completing the registration process, eligible professionals would be able to work for up to six months.

This applies to over 300 certifications in regulated, non-health professions like engineering, architecture, construction, and manufacturing. For employers, this framework means reduced hiring delays and administrative barriers, and faster access to skilled talent.

Increase in Minimum Wage

Many provinces/territories have announced increases to their minimum wage. Please see the chart below for more information.

Ontario	\$17.20 per hour	\$17.60, effective October 1, 2025
Prince Edward Island	\$16.00 per hour	\$16.50, effective October 1, 2025
Saskatchewan	\$15.00 per hour	\$15.35, effective October 1, 2025
